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BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

- Early 90s: Recreation Access Federal Advisory Committee GCSSA was represented
- Developed recommended accessibility guidelines for golf courses
- 2002: Board issues final rule later incorporated into revised ADAAG 2004
- 2010 Standards for Accessible Design New construction and alteration after 3/15/12.
- Discussions followed on "accessible" golf carts

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AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT-TITLE II

 State and local government golf facilities



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AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT-TITLE III

- Commercial facilities
- Places of public accommodation
- Non-profit as well as forprofit



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ARCHITECTURAL BARRIERS ACT

- Facilities that are designed constructed, altered, or leased by or on behalf of the federal government
- Facilities receiving certain types of federal financial assistance



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ALTERATIONS TO EXISTING FACILITIES

- Provisions apply to the planned scope of work
- Path of travel requirements apply to work on the course



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WHAT'S CONSIDERED AN ALTERATION

- Examples of alterations
 - Redesigning teeing grounds
 - Re-surfacing parking lots
- Mowing and other general maintenance activities are not considered alterations



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REQUIREMENTS FOR ALTERATIONS

- Follow accessibility Standards for new construction
- What you touch you fix
- Alterations to "primary function areas" carry additional obligations



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ALTERATIONS

Technical Infeasibility

- Determined case-by-case
- Based on existing constraints/conditions and scope of work
- •Compliance required to the *maximum* extent feasible

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SAFE HARBOR – EXISTING FACILITIES

- Elements that comply with 1991 Standards do not need to be modified to meet the 2010 Standards unless those elements are altered on or after March 15, 2012
- Safe Harbor does not apply to elements in existing facilities that were not subject to specific requirements in the 1991 Standards



ELEMENTS IN 2010 STANDARDS NOT SUBJECT TO SAFE HARBOR

- (A) Residential facilities and dwelling units
- (B) Amusement rides
- (C) Recreational boating facilities
- (D) Exercise machines and equipment
- (E) Fishing piers and platforms
- (F) Golf facilities
- (G) Miniature golf facilities
- (H) Play areas

- (I) Saunas and steam rooms
- (J) Swimming pools, wading pools, and spas
- (K) Shooting facilities with firing positions
- (L) Miscellaneous.
 - 1. Team or player seating
 - 2. Accessible route to

bowling lanes

3. Accessible routes in court sports facilities

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GOLF TECHNICAL PROVISIONS §1006

- Accessible Routes
- Golf car passages
- Weather shelters




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
GOLF COURSE ACCESSIBLE ROUTES




- Golf car passage "Continuous passage on which a motorized golf car can operate"
- 48-inch minimum width
- 60 inches min. width if handrails are provided



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GOLF CAR PASSAGE SPECIFICATIONS

- 48-inch minimum width
- 60-inch minimum width if handrails are provided



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GOLF CAR PASSAGE COURSE BARRIERS

 Openings at least 60 inches wide at intervals not exceeding 75 yards must be provided




COURSE BARRIERS

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MULTIPLE TEEING GROUNDS

- Forward tee accessible except in alterations where not feasible due to terrain
 - 2 or more forward tee
 - 3 or more at least two




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WEATHER SHELTERS

 Clear space of 60 inches minimum by 96 inches minimum



WEATHER SHELTER

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PUTTING GREENS

 Putting greens – each putting green designed and constructed so that a golf car can enter and exit



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DRIVING RANGES

 Where teeing stations or practice teeing grounds are provided, at least 5%, not less than one



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EXISITING GOLF COURSES

• EXCEPTION: In existing golf courses, the forward teeing ground shall not be required to be one of the teeing grounds on a hole designed and constructed so that a golf car can enter and exit the teeing ground where compliance is not feasible due to terrain.



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MINIATURE GOLF FACILITIES §239 & §1007



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SCOPING PROVISIONS §239

- Minimum number
- Course configuration



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TECHNICAL PROVISIONS §1007



- Accessible routes
- Start of play
- Golf club reach range area



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MINIATURE GOLF COURSE CONFIGURATION

- 50% of holes required to be accessible and consecutive
- Exception permits one break, provided the last hole is included
- Accessible route cannot travel back through completed holes if only 50% of holes are accessible and consecutive



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MINIATURE GOLF ACCESSIBLE ROUTE

 Accessible route may be provided on the playing surface or adjacent to it




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START OF PLAY AREA

- 48" x 60" clear space at the start of play for each accessible hole allows players to position themselves for the first shot.
 - 1:48 max slope
 - Accessible route and clear space can overlap






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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE

- Firm, stable, slip resistant
- May include a maximum slope of 1:4 for a maximum 4-inch rise
- Steeper slopes permitted for limited distances
- Handrails not required



ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE WITH OPENING ONTO ADJACENT ACCESSIBLE ROUTE

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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE – CARPET EXCEPTION

 Carpet exempt from complying with 302.2




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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE – RAMP EXCEPTIONS

- Ramp landing length specified by 405.7.3 are permitted to be 48 inches long min.
- Ramps that change direction at landings specified by 405.7.4 are permitted to be 48 inches minimum by 60 inches min.



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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE – HANDRAIL EXCEPTION

- Handrails are not required on holes
- Where handrails are provided on holes, they are not required to comply with 505



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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ON PLAYING SURFACE – CURB EXCEPTION

Where accessible routes intersect playing surfaces of accessible holes, a 1-inch maximum curb is permitted for a width of 32 inches.




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ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ADJACENT TO PLAYING SURFACE

- Must not exceed 36 inches from any area where golf balls rest
- As close to the level playing areas as possible
 - 1:12 max. slope
 - 36" min. width
 - 1:48 max. cross slope



ACCESSIBLE ROUTES ADJACENT TO PLAYING SURFACE

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GOLF CLUB REACH RANGE



EXAMPLES OF GOLF CLUB REACH RANGES ON PLAYING SURFACE




Fig. 63 Golf Club Reach Range

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ACCESSIBLE ROUTES

- Continuous, unobstructed paths connecting all accessible elements and spaces of the facility
- Connect facility entrance with first accessible hole and with start of play area on each following accessible hole
- Configure course to allow easy exit from the last accessible hole to the facility entrance/exit
- When all holes are not accessible, a player cannot be required to double back through holes to exit.

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
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CLUBHOUSE & OTHER AMENITIES





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PARKING - Scoping

- Parking not required, but if provided, accessible parking required
 - Exception for parking for buses, trucks, delivery vehicles, law enforcement vehicles, or vehicular impound.
- For every 6 or fraction of 6 accessible spaces, one must be a van space, (16 feet in width).
- Accessible spaces must be on the shortest accessible route to entrances served relative to other spaces.
- Accessible spaces must be dispersed among accessible entrances served.



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PARKING & PASSENGER LOADING

- Space and access aisle width marked to define width.
- Access aisle marked to discourage parking.
- Accessible parking spaces identified with sign containing ISA; van spaces identified "van accessible"
- Passenger loading zone where provided




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TEMPORARY FACILITIES

- Bleachers for tournaments, assembly seating areas, portable toilet facilities.
- Access to temporary facilities on golf course may be achieved through either an accessible route or golf are passage



ACCESSIBLE BLEACHERS

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SIGNS



Tactile/visual for permanent rooms & spaces



Exterior directional or information signs *recommend following visual information req.'s*

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SIGNS - EXCEPTION

Temporary signs
Building menus
Directories
Addresses
Company names/logos




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SALES & SERVICE COUNTERS

- At least 1 of each type of counter
- Each type of function at a counter
- Dispersion where counters are dispersed
- Access for either a forward or side approach



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DINING SURFACES



- Access to at least 5% of standing and seating spaces
- Dispersion within the space/facility
- Recommended: Integrate accessible seating with other seating




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
REACH RANGES


- Side reach, like forward reach is 15" to 48" if unobstructed.
- Max reach depth for this range is 10"



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OBSTRUCTED HIGH REACH





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Drinking Fountains & Bottle Fillers



- ADA does not require drinking fountains.
- Where drinking fountains are provided, one wheelchair-accessible and one for standees required.
- Bottle fillers may not substitute for either of these required drinking fountains.
- Per ADA may provide bottle fillers instead of drinking fountains.
- Bottle fillers must meet requirements for operable parts.

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
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TOILET FACILITIES


- In new construction, all toilet facilities must be accessible, except:
 - Portable units (5% min)
 - Clustered single user toilet rooms (50% min)



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BATHING FACILITIES (§603)

At least one shower or tub required

Options:


- transfer shower stall
- roll-in shower
- tubs



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
DRESSING & LOCKER ROOMS (§222)



 Access to at least 5% of each type of use in each cluster

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
